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1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice.

Unless covered in this addendum, our normal behaviour policy continues to apply.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes.

We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and students.

2. Expectations for students in school

2.1 New rules

A new one-way system is in place at school. Students are expected to follow this during peak lesson changeover times.

Masks must be worn on lesson changeover times when students are crossing bubbles.

When students are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact their HOY, if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

General Rules

- Students arrive on a staggered time and must go straight to their form rooms upon arrival.
- Keep social distance at all times.
- Do NOT risk the health and safety of other students and staff
- Use the hand sanitisers at every opportunity
- The mobile phone policy will be relaxed at breaktime **ONLY**
- Report to a member of staff, immediately, if you develop any COVID 19 symptoms

The main symptoms of are:

- **high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with COVID 19 have at least one of these symptoms.

Classroom Rules

- Do as you are told, first time, every time
- Arrive on time for all lessons with the correct equipment
- Maintain social distancing at ALL times
- Coughing and sneezing needs 'catching, binning & killing'
- You must not chew or eat in class and only drink water (apart from lunch)
- Sit where you are told to with your equipment ready on the desk
- Do not move around the classroom for any length of time
- Raise your hand and wait to speak
- Listen carefully when the teacher or another student is talking
- Respect the teaching and learning of others
- Pack away only when told to, stand, wait quietly standing until dismissed

Around School Rules

- Do as you are told, first time, every time
- Maintain social distancing at ALL times
- Walk around the school quietly and sensibly respecting other people's space
- **Absolutely NO spitting**
- Coughing and sneezing needs 'catching, binning and killing'
- Have respect for the school environment and put litter in the bins
- Follow the one-way system during peak lesson changeover
- Wear your mask around the school site unless medically exempt.

General Hygiene

Wash your hands and use hand sanitiser.

- On arrival to school
- On leaving a lesson
- On returning to class
- Before eating
- After eating
- After using the toilet

Try not to touch your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands

Do not share items that come into contact with your mouth such as cups and bottles

2.2 Rewards and sanctions for following rules

To help encourage students to follow the above rules:

Merits will continue to be issued under the original behaviour policy.

A new set of tangible rewards will be allocated on a cumulative basis

However, if students fail to follow these rules, we will use the Consequence system in our original behaviour policy

Additional consequences for failing to 'stay safe' or 'failing to help other students stay safe' have been added

C2 - accidental failure to follow school policy for staying safe

C6 – deliberate failure to follow school policy for staying safe

3. Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated, and as a minimum every 2 weeks by Craig Fenton, Assistant Principal. At every review, it will be approved by an appropriate group of Governors.
