

## **Scenarios where remote education should be provided**

Remote education will be provided if:

- school leaders decide that it is not possible for the school to open safely, or that opening would contradict guidance from local or central government
- when individual students, for a limited duration, are unable to physically attend their school but are able to continue learning, for example students with an infectious illness

In these circumstances, students will have access to remote education as soon as reasonably practicable, though in proportion to the length of absence and disruption to their learning.

We aim to provide remote education equivalent in length to the core teaching students would receive in school. The remote education may include recorded or live direct teaching time (please note that lessons developed by external providers may be used), as well as tasks set on SMHW.

To help students access remote learning, Salendine Nook High School Academy can:

- loan school-owned laptops
- loan dongles to assist with internet connectivity issues
- providing printed resources, such as textbooks and workbooks
- work with families to rapidly identify effective solutions where engagement is a concern
- check whether students learning remotely are engaging with their work

## **Provision for students with SEND**

We recognise that some students with SEND may not be able to access remote education without adult support. We will work collaboratively with families and put in place reasonable adjustments so that students with SEND can successfully access remote education.
